MARCH 9 – MAY 10, 1781

March 9: Spanish fleet begins its assault into Pensacola Bay as land forces conduct amphibious landings against key British positions guarding the entrance to the bay.

2

March 9-24: Spanish fleet maneuvers to attack the mainland.

3

March 29: Spanish troops conduct amphibious assault onto mainland.

4

March 29-May 9: Spanish troops dig a trench line extending toward the British lines.

5

April 22: The French fleet arrives and disembark soldiers that assist Galvez.

6

May 10: Campbell surrenders Fort George and his troops to Galvez.


