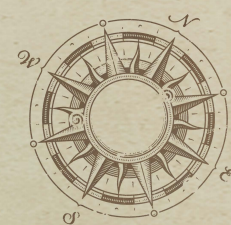

- 1 Clark camps on the bank of the Wabash River, Feb. 18-21, 1779
- 2 Upper Mamell camp, night of Feb. 21, 1779
- 3 Sugar Camp, night of Feb. 22, 1779
- 4 Clark rests his troops on dry ground, Feb. 23, 1779
- 5 Warriors Island, resting place on Feb. 23, 1779
- 6 Clark arrives at 8:00 p.m. on Feb. 23, 1779
- 7 Hamilton surrenders the fort at 10:00 a.m. Feb. 25, 1779
