

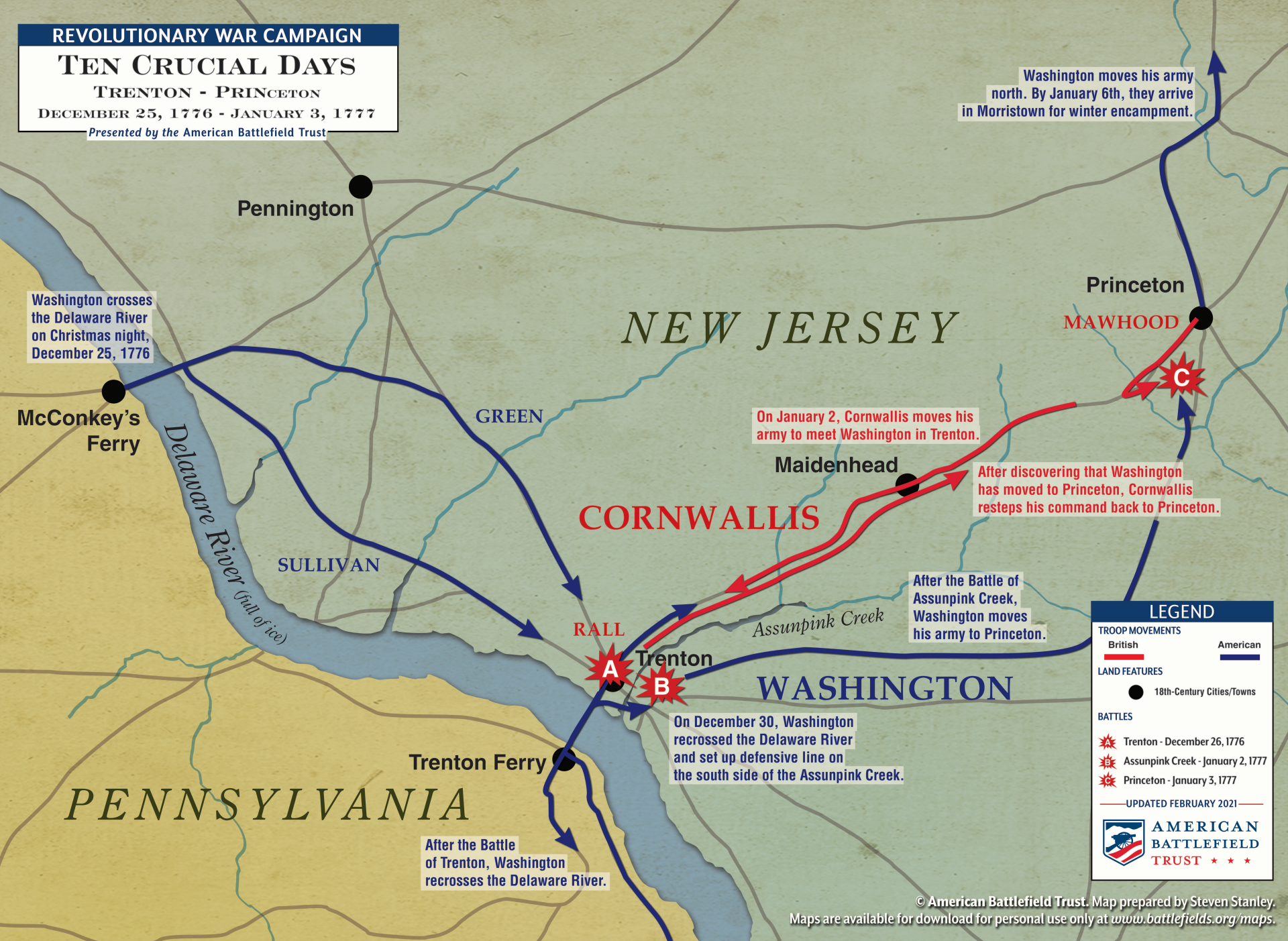

Pennington

NEW JERSEY

Washington moves his army north. By January 6th, they arrive in Morristown for winter encampment.

Princeton
MAWHOOD

On January 2, Cornwallis moves his army to meet Washington in Trenton.

Maidenhead

After discovering that Washington has moved to Princeton, Cornwallis rests his command back to Princeton.

CORNWALLIS

After the Battle of Assunpink Creek, Washington moves his army to Princeton.
