The British occupied Mt. Defiance on July 5th.

After the British occupy Mt. Defiance, St. Clair evacuates Fort Ticonderoga via the boat bridge linking to Mount Independence.

The Americans retreat to Hubbardton via the Military Road and to Skenesboro via ships.

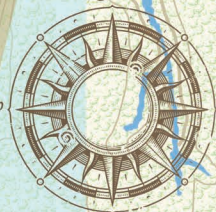
