3. Using the specifications given to you by your teacher please answer the following questions:

- A. Note the dimensions of each hut. Each log was approximately 9" in diameter.
- Length = 14'
- Width = 16'
- Heighth = 12'

*Note:

- 1. When the height reached 6 ½ feet, logs were extended by 1' on each side. Then, the eave logs tapered in length to reach the maximum height.
- 2. Each log was cut to the length necessary for each side. Example 14'x 9".
- B. Approximately how much lumber would Washington's army have needed to build the total number of huts? You may also choose to draw a sketch to help you.

BATTLEFIELD

- 1. Approximately 25-30 logs per hut.
 - a. Note that chink/mud was used in between the logs to act as mortar.
 - b. If you would like an extension, you can also have your students figure out the area of the roof. They can also calculate the number of 4' x 2' wood slabs (used as shingles) that would have been used to cover the roof.
 - i. $14' \times 16' \times 2(sides) = 448 \text{ square foot}$
