Point aux Trembles

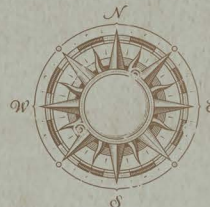
Montgomery arrives at Point aux Trembles on December 3, and with Arnold's forces lay siege on Quebec City and assaulting the city on December 31, 1775.
