THE MILITIA IS ROUTED

2 General Gates, fleeing in the first wave of retreating troops, rides 60 miles all the way back to Charlotte Town, North Carolina. On Dec. 3rd he is replaced by General Nathanael Greene, as Commander for the Southern Department.

1 Gates' left collapses, VA Militia scatter, followed by Butler and Rutherford's NC Militia.

4 Dixon's NC Militia reinforced with Continental Detachment holds the line under Gregory's command.

3 de Kalb attacks and is counterattacked in a back-and-forth action on the west flank.
