WASHINGTON (~11,000 troops)

Tennant Church

3 Seeing the British withdrawing, Washington begins a cautious offensive. First he sends Scott's Light Infantry to attack the Highlanders position.

2 Realizing he has lost the initiative, Cornwallis starts his withdraw from the battlefield.

4 Washington sends Wayne and his 400 men to attack the withdrawing British on the Rhea farm.

5 The 1st Grenadiers and 33rd Foot drive back Wayne's attack. But with enfilading fire from Comb's Hill they withdraw from the battlefield.

1 Approx. 3:30 in the afternoon, Washington sends Greene to Comb's Hill to establish an enfilading artillery position.
