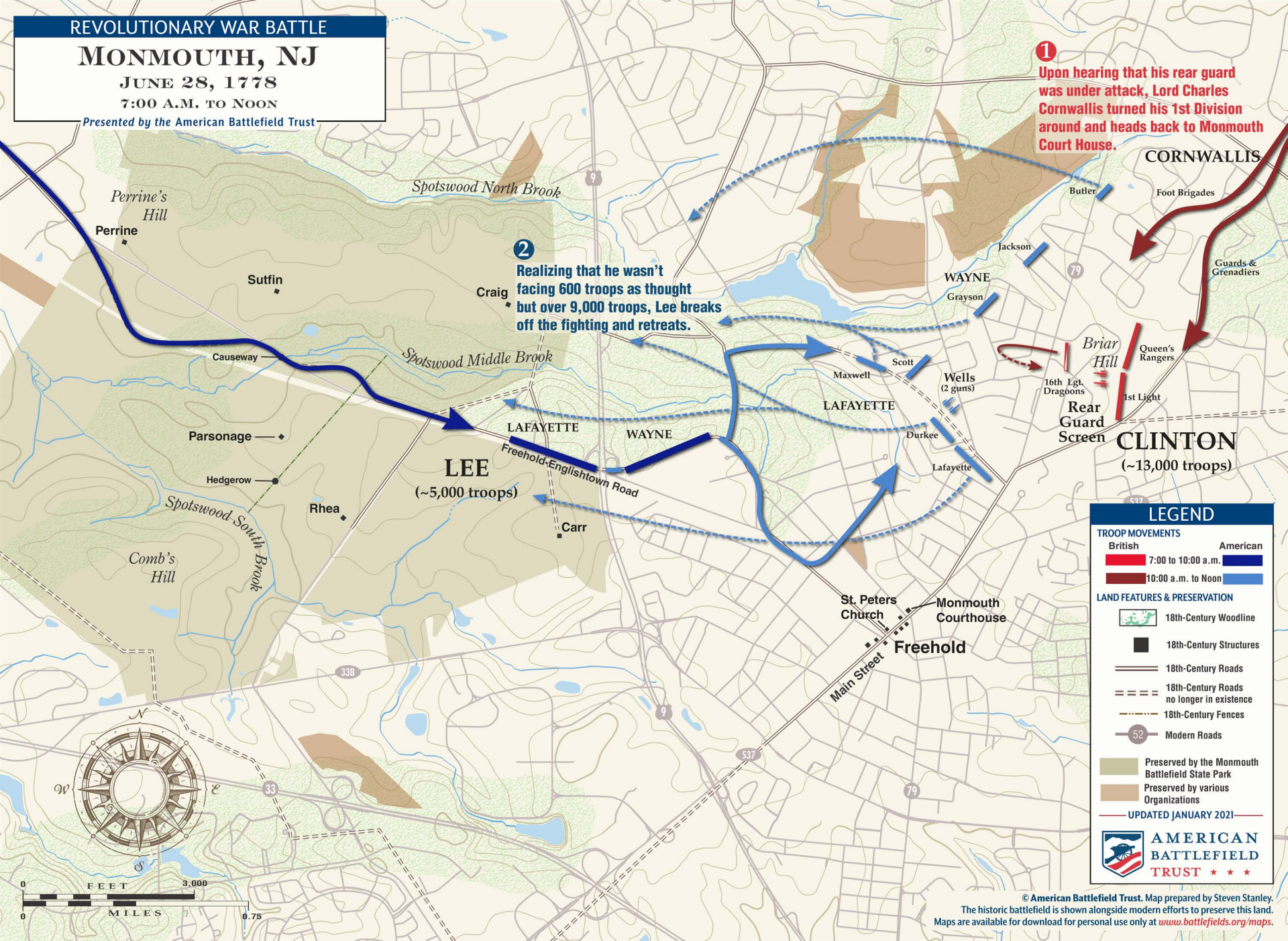
JUNE 28, 1778

1 Upon hearing that his rear guard was under attack, Lord Charles Cornwallis turned his 1st Division around and heads back to Monmouth Court House.

2 Realizing that he wasn't facing 600 troops as thought but over 9,000 troops, Lee breaks off the fighting and retreats.
