NEW YORK

Washington crosses the Hudson River with the main army at 3 locations on November 12-14, 1776. Lee follows on December 2 at Verplanck's Pt.

NEW JERSEY

LEE

Washington arrives at Morristown on January 6, 1777

Lee is captured on December 13, 1776

SULLIVAN

WASHINGTON

Washington crosses the Delaware River on Christmas night, December 25, 1776

CORNWALLIS

Cornwallis races to Trenton with reinforcements beginning on December 26, 1776.

British General Howe lands his troops on Staten Island beginning on July 2, 1776.
