Washington goes into winter quarters at Valley Forge, December 19, 1777

HOWE

Howe lands in Elkton on Aug. 25, 1777

NEW JERSEY

November 23, 1777 The British fleet secures the Delaware Bay, allowing Howe to use the Delaware River to supply his army.

Washington departs Haverstraw on July 24, 1777

Howe departs New York City on July 23, 1777

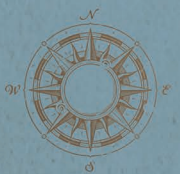
Clinton arrives in New York City July 5, 1778

After the Battle of Monmouth, Washington moves through New Brunswick and Haverstraw to White Plains, arriving on July 20, 1778

CLINTON

Clinton abandons Philadelphia June 1778 and heads back to New York City
