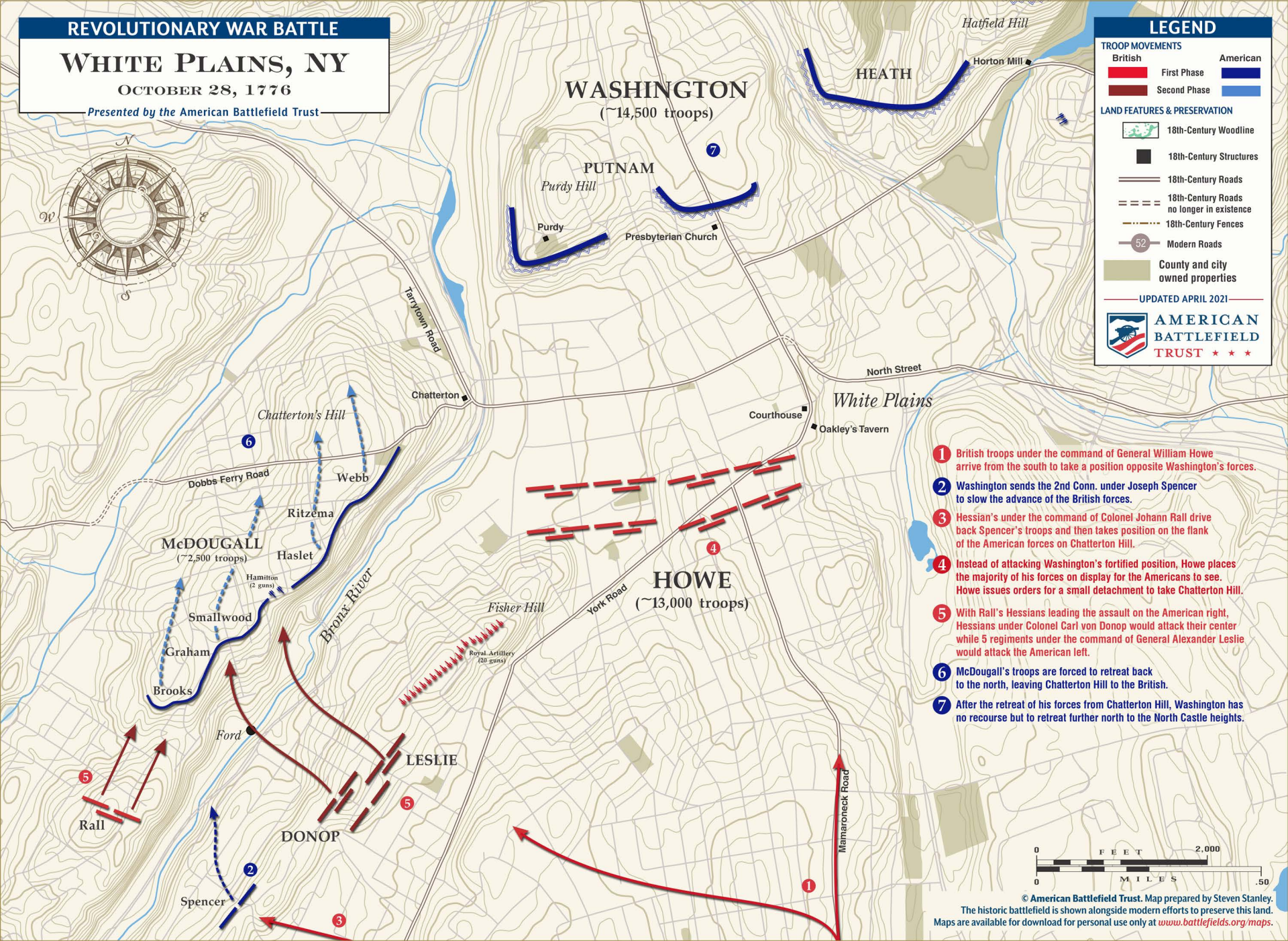

UPDATED APRIL 2021



- 1 British troops under the command of General William Howe arrive from the south to take a position opposite Washington's forces.
- 2 Washington sends the 2nd Conn. under Joseph Spencer to slow the advance of the British forces.
- 3 Hessian's under the command of Colonel Johann Rall drive back Spencer's troops and then takes position on the flank of the American forces on Chatterton Hill.
- 4 Instead of attacking Washington's fortified position, Howe places the majority of his forces on display for the Americans to see. Howe issues orders for a small detachment to take Chatterton Hill.
- 5 With Rall's Hessians leading the assault on the American right, Hessians under Colonel Carl von Donop would attack their center while 5 regiments under the command of General Alexander Leslie would attack the American left.
- 6 McDougall's troops are forced to retreat back to the north, leaving Chatterton Hill to the British.
- 7 After the retreat of his forces from Chatterton Hill, Washington has no recourse but to retreat further north to the North Castle heights.
