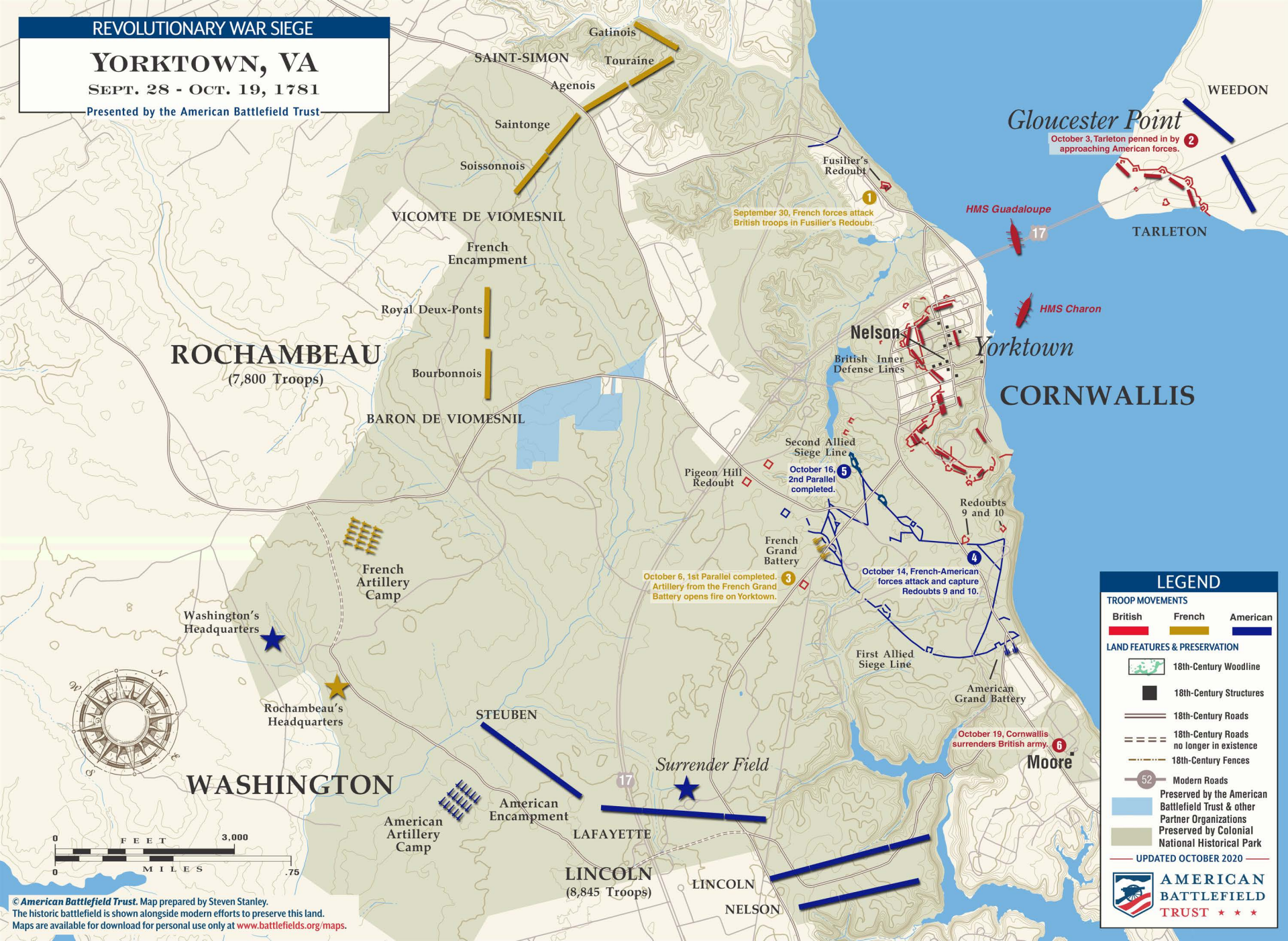

September 30, French forces attack British troops in Fusilier's Redoubt.

British Inner Defense Lines

Second Allied Siege Line

October 16, 2nd Parallel completed.

Pigeon Hill Redoubt

October 6, 1st Parallel completed. Artillery from the French Grand Battery opens fire on Yorktown.

French Grand Battery

Redoubts 9 and 10

October 14, French-American forces attack and capture Redoubts 9 and 10.

First Allied Siege Line

American Grand Battery

October 19, Cornwallis surrenders British army.

October 3, Tarleton pinned in by approaching American forces.
