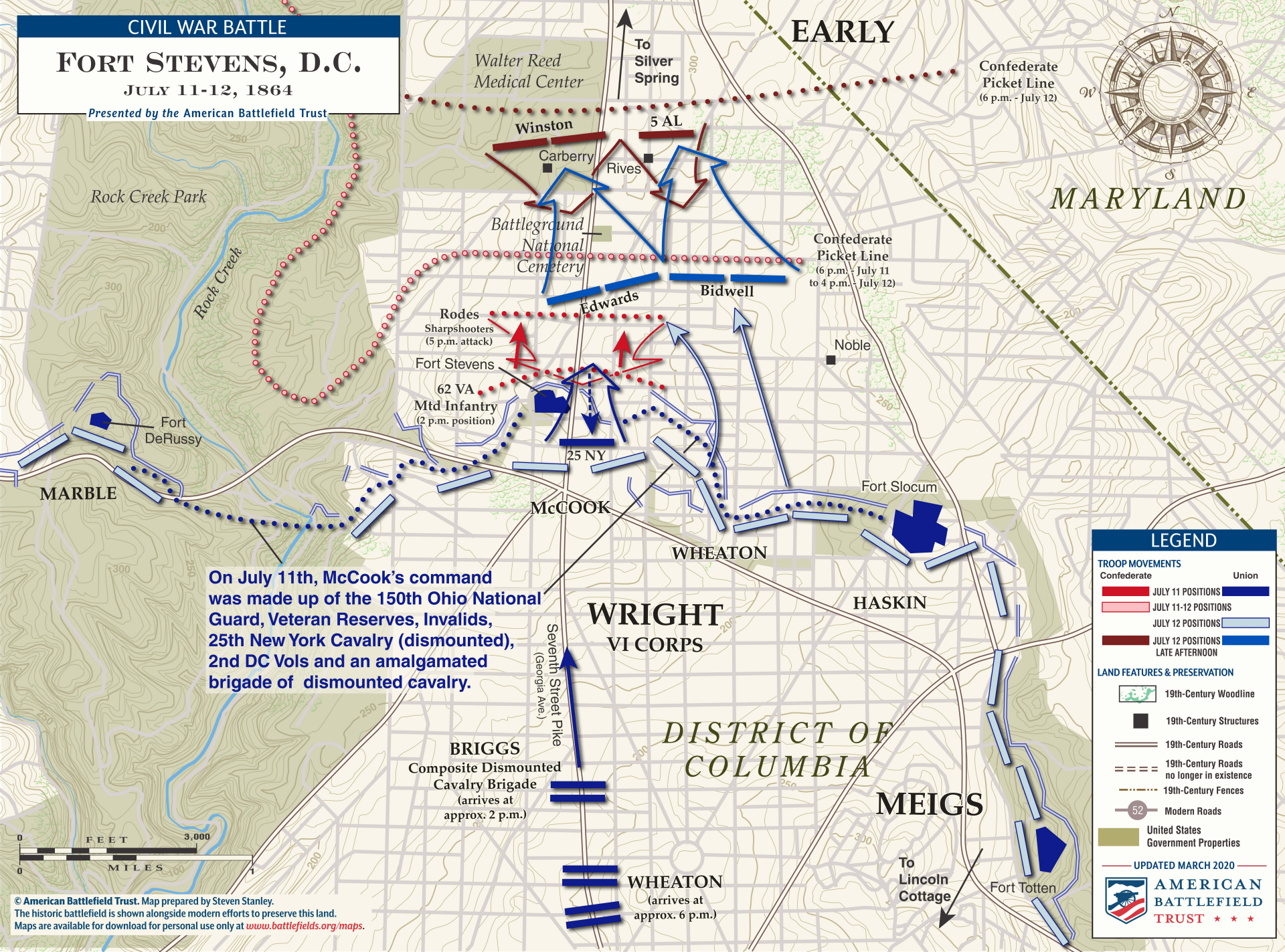

On July 11th, McCook's command was made up of the 150th Ohio National Guard, Veteran Reserves, Invalids, 25th New York Cavalry (dismounted), 2nd DC Vols and an amalgamated brigade of dismounted cavalry.
