A visit to Gettysburg is always an educational experience for young adults. But with recent developments, travel and school trips have become less common. And of course, many students are just too far away for the full Gettysburg on-site experience.

On the 157th anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg, the brand-new Lydia Ziegler Clare Education Center for on-site and digital learning opened with the technology for museum staff to conduct distance-learning programs. Students can now visit Gettysburg virtually with digital lessons and video lectures that take stories, photos, and artifacts outside the museum walls and into the classrooms all over the country.

All lessons meet state and national education standards and are designed to be interactive, giving students a chance to practice what they have learned and for educators to provide feedback.

Just some of our interactive activities include:

- Video lectures about the Battle of Gettysburg and underlying themes of the Civil War.
- Guided analysis of the Gettysburg Address and its meaning for the present and future.
- Examination of the struggles of escaping slaves during their Underground Railroad journey.
- Investigation of the decisions of surgeons doing triage during and after the battle.
- Exploration of how we remember and think about the Civil War today.

Give your students the experience of learning leadership, decision-making, and critical thinking skills in the context of the Civil War and complete their true understanding of this important milestone in Civil War history.
