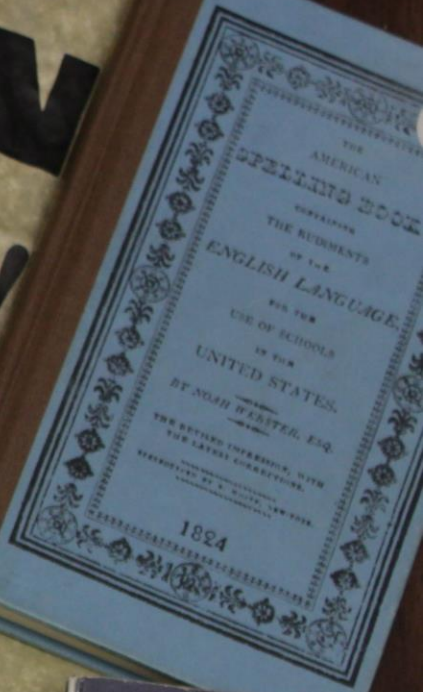
THE UNION IS DISSOLVED!

Passed unanimously at 1.15 o'clock, P. M., December 20th, 1860.

AN ORDINANCE

To dissolve the Union between the State of South Carolina and other States united with her under the compact entitled "The Constitution of the United States of America."

We, the People of the State of South Carolina, in Convention assembled, do declare and ordain, and that the Ordinance adopted by us in Convention, on the twenty-third day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight, whereby the Constitution of the United States of America was ratified, and also, all amendments of the said Constitution, are hereby repealed; and the said Ordinance, together with all Acts and parts of Acts of the General Assembly of this State, ratifying amendments of the said Constitution, are hereby repealed; and the Union between South Carolina and other States, under the name of the United States of America, is hereby dissolved.

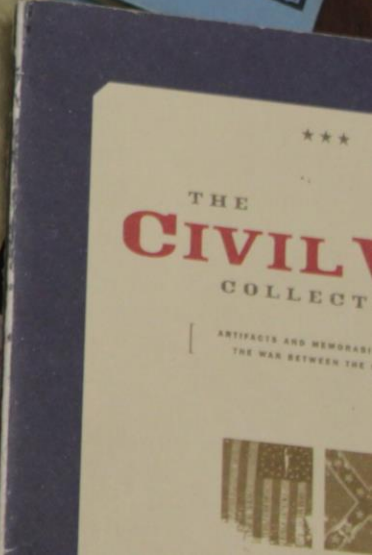

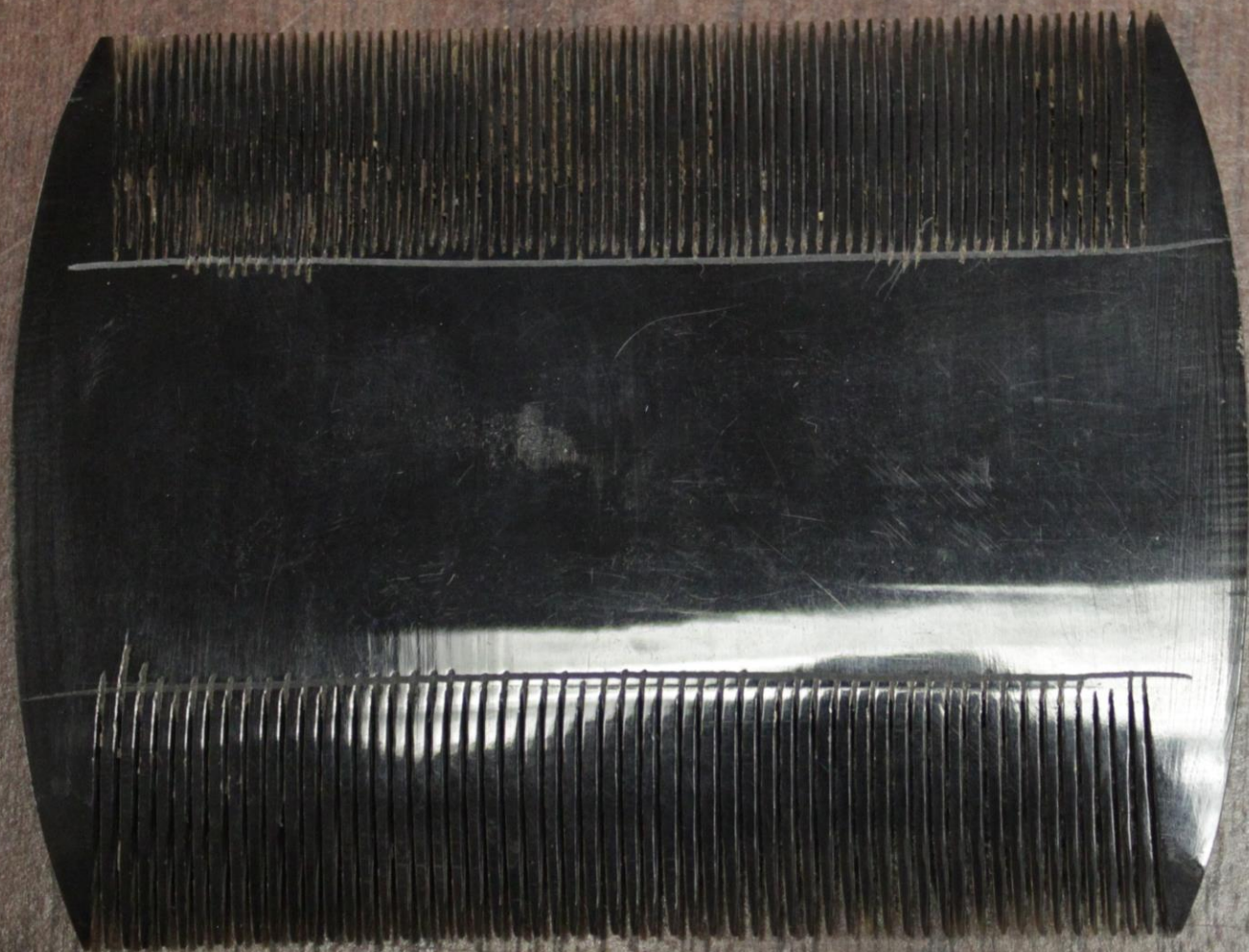

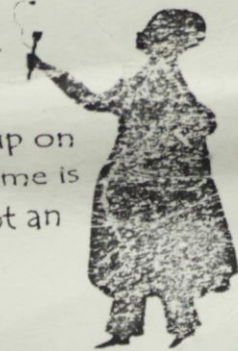



¹ DPA SERIES: SLAVERY - The slave-sale poster dates from 1769. The importance of slaves from Africa (starting in 1619) became particularly important after unsuccessful attempts by colonists to enslave American Indians. At the outbreak of the American Revolution 20% of the total colonial population were slaves. Slavery disappeared in the Northern states by 1846.
