WHAT IS PARK DAY?

Since 1996, the Civil War Trust has sponsored Park Day, an annual hands-on preservation event to help Civil War, Revolutionary War, and War of 1812 battlefields and historic sites take on maintenance projects large and small. Activities are chosen by each participating site to meet its own particular needs and can range from hauling trash to trail building and sign painting.



Park Day is an excellent opportunity to bring history enthusiasts together to help keep our nation's heritage preserved and pristine. For participating sites, Park Day has the potential to be an extremely rewarding and productive source of volunteer labor for the maintenance and upkeep of your site. 130 sites participated in Park Day 2016 throughout the country, with nearly 6,000 volunteers donating over 24,000 man-hours. Please encourage partners at other sites to join the event as well!

FINDING VOLUNTEERS

Park Day is about finding volunteers from the surrounding community to come out and pitch in for preservation.
